## International Geneva Welcome Centre (CAGI)

CAGI was founded in 1996; its mission is to facilitate the settling-in and integration to Geneva and the Lake Geneva region of all international employees and their families:

- civil servants
- members of Permanent Missions,
- consulates,
- NGOs,
- employees of multinational companies,
- PhD students and professors at Hôpitaux Universitaires de Genève and at the University of Geneva

Besides practical assistance, CAGI organises and supports cultural and social events, enabling exchange between the Geneva International and local communities.

#### **Founding members**

## Services offered by CAGI for International Geneva's newcomers

- Welcome Service: a programme of activities for international newcomers to facilitate their integration and help them to discover Geneva's multicultural aspects and traditions. This programme is coordinated by CAGI and run by the Newcomer Network of the Fondation pour Genève, a group of Geneva-based volunteers who help the CAGI in its mission of welcoming and promoting relations between Geneva's international community and the local population.
- Housing support: support in accommodation search, lease proofreading, administrative procedures, litigation, insurance, education, health and mobility.

#### Practical Geneva:

- information on topics such as housing, health, education and mobility, to make settling-in and living in Geneva easier.
- online platforms for finding a job, accommodation or household staff.
- **Social events**: open to all, in collaboration with different entities from local and international Geneva.
- Cultural Kiosks at UN Geneva and CERN: information on the cultural and tourist offers of the region, ticket sales.





## Welcome call

Based on the lists sent monthly by the Federal Department of Foreign Affairs (FDFA), a welcome letter is addressed to those arriving during the month, informing them of the services offered by CAGI, and specifically the Newcomer Network programme. 3 volunteers in charge of the programme will contact these newcomers by telephone. These calls are greatly appreciated and allow a personalised welcome. They often bring immediate help, or a rapid response, to practical questions faced by all newcomers.

# Lunchtime conferences

All International newcomers to Geneva are invited to lunchtime conferences held throughout the year. These conferences provide newcomers with the opportunity to learn about practical, social and cultural aspects of life in Geneva. ## Monday 4 December 2023 from 6 pm



The Kiosk's Cultural Agenda lists a whole range of offers and recommendations, which are communicated in a weekly newsletter.






