Services offered by CAGI for International Geneva's newcomers

• The Welcome Programme: offers a series of activities designed to facilitate the integration of international newcomers to Geneva. These activities are intended to provide an insight into the city's multicultural aspects and traditions. This programme is coordinated by CAGI and run by the Newcomer Network of the Fondation pour Genève, a group of Geneva-based volunteers who assist CAGI in its mission of welcoming and fostering connections between the international community and the local population



• **Practical guide for newcomers:** essential information on settling in and integrating into Geneva for internationals and their families.



- Housing support: accommodation search, lease proofreading, administrative procedures, litigation support, insurance, online housing platform.
- Cultural Kiosks at UN Geneva and CERN: provide information on cultural and tourist offerings in the region, as well as tickets at preferential rates.

WELCOME CALL

Each month, based on official lists provided by the Federal Department of Foreign Affairs (FDFA), the programme's volunteers reach out to newcomers with a welcome call.

More than just a greeting, this personalised call provides newcomers with practical information and reliable answers to help them settle in smoothly.

WELCOME COFFEE

Information session over coffee and croissants for international newcomers and their families in Geneva and the surrounding area.

By invitation, organised every 2 months.

LUNCHTIME CONFERENCES

These conferences, open to all newcomers to International Geneva, provide an invaluable opportunity to gain insight into the practical, social, and cultural aspects of Geneva throughout the year.

These excursions take place on a monthly basis, on Saturdays, allowing participants to bring their families along. The group of Geneva-based volunteers creates opportunities for newcomers to connect and build friendships with local residents. Registration to the programme is free of charge and valid for one year (non-renewable).

Invitations will be sent to all 2025-2026 newcomers who have registered for the Welcome Programme.

AUGUST

A visit to a farm in the countryside on the left bank before tasting local produce. A fun-filled excursion for families and children!

SEPTEMBER

Discover the secrets of the grape harvest and practice this trade for a morning.

OCTOBER

A visit to the Geneva studios, film sets and backstage of Swiss television (RTS).

NOVEMBER

A guided tour of the Old Town, followed by a welcome and official reception hosted by the authorities at the Town Hall. In the afternoon, a visit and performance at the Théâtre de Vidy.


DECEMBER

Discover medieval Geneva and its secret passages, before celebrating the traditional 'Fète de l'Escalade' in a private club in the Old Town

JANUARY

Guided tour of Geneva's Public Transportation (tpg) HQ, followed by a ride on an old historic tram through the city.











FEBRUARY

On the Col de la Givrine in the Jura mountains, a snowshoe tour followed by a hearty cheese « fondue » in the late afternoon. MARCH

Welcome and reception at Nyon Castle before exploring the town with a guided tour. **APRIL**

While exploring the city, you will gain insight into the history of humanitarian action, the Geneva Conventions, and the work of the Red Cross and Red Crescent Movement. MAY
